Hello Squad Leader Fanatic type persons,

Our first session (June, hello summer!) had 5 people in attendance. It was supposed to be 6 but one person "forgot" to come. I won't mention any names....(Chris). Jon F. and I played against Rick Hollander and stopped his Americans from taking 25 building hexes of a village in Aachen, Germany. In fact he didn't even get across the first street. He played well but his opponents laid down row after row of well placed residual fire (they must have read the article on residual in the last newsletter). The scenario was titled **Simple Equation.** We had a new player named **Joe Pellam** who joined us for an evening of die rolling fun. He played Dave T. in the same scenario. Dave's Americans did cross the street and may break through the flank to gain a lot of those required 25 buildings. We don't know if they will yet because Dave and Joe need to finish the game. We are holding it on the side and they will finish it next month. There's a first (holding the game till later)! I just couldn't bring myself to call the game in either players favor. It looks close.

The **second session** also had five people in attendance. We played a miniature ASL scenario called **Breaking Brokruisk.** Greg Haas and David Kleinschmidt played the Germans (they had to, with good German names like that). The attacking Soviet pigs had to capture 4 of 5 large buildings. The roles of the Soviet pigs were played by Dave T., Jon F. and Rick H. They easily crossed the street through Dave's firelane, they made tons of moral checks, they blasted away with a 152 mm assault gun, and they routed the German defenders from the first two buildings. The Germans rolled a ton of boxcars and couldn't even fall back to a safe rallying place and so, the German's lost.

Dave and Joe will have to finish that game left over from session one later. since we did a group game this month.

A miniatures game was played for our **third session.** We played a scenario called **Bad Luck**, and it ended up being bad luck for the German's. Dave T and Joe (the new guy who missed the second session because Dave K. messed up his email address, and didn't notify him. Good thing he checked in to see why he was missed in July) led a German assault against Dave K and Jon F.'s Americans. This game ended after three turns (the Germans lost the 19 V.P.'s while attacking, *that* resulted in a loss). Dave T couldn't make a morale check. The Germans forgot to place smoke with their tanks against the big firepower U.S. positions. A couple of critical U.S. snake-eyes helped stop the assault. It was really cool to see everything in miniature. We debated whether or not the game was balanced as the German's had to cross some ground covered only by some terrain that was a hindrance, not an obstacle. Most of us thought the scenario was balanced and came down to the previously mentioned factors. Joe and Jon sure love their tanks!
